Working-Poor and Near-Poor Families in Hawaii Are Hit Harder by the Income Tax Than Those in Most Other States

Hawaii's 2006 income tax threshold

Rank among the 42 states with income taxes

(The income level at which families begin paying income tax)

(1 = lowest threshold)

- For single-parent families of three: \$9,800 3
- For two-parent families of four: \$11,500 4

Hawaii's 2006 income tax levied on working-poor and near-poor families

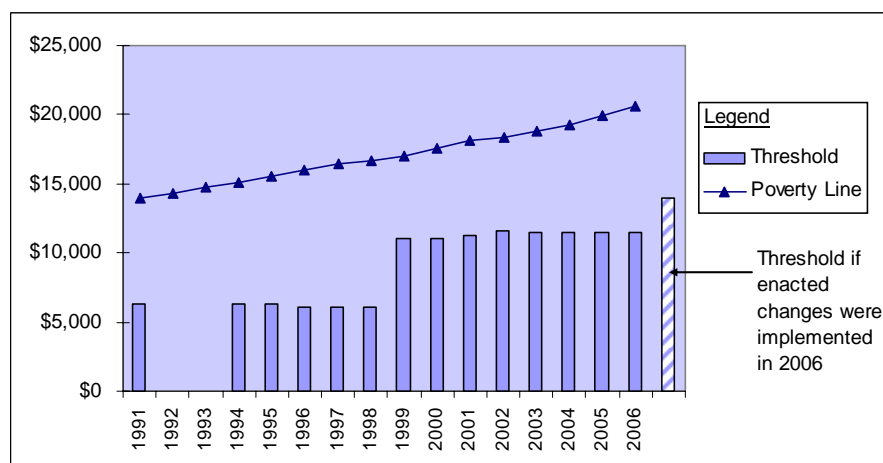
Rank (1 = highest tax)

- For families of three with incomes at the poverty line (\$16,079): \$401 2
- For families of four with incomes at the poverty line (\$20,615): \$546 2
- For families of three with minimum-wage earnings (\$14,040): \$243 1
- For families of three with incomes at 125% of poverty line (\$20,099): \$681 2
- For families of four with incomes at 125% of poverty line (\$25,769): \$862 2

Hawaii has consistently levied income tax on working-poor families.

- Hawaii's tax threshold for families of four was increased in 1999, but since then it has declined from 65 percent of the poverty line to 56 percent of the poverty line.
- Changes scheduled to take effect in 2007 will increase Hawaii's thresholds somewhat, but Hawaii will remain among the states with very high taxes on the poor.
