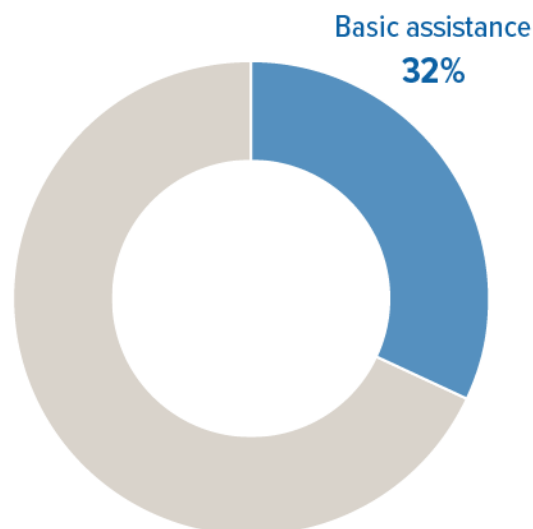


# South Carolina TANF Spending

In 2019, South Carolina spent about **\$165 million in federal and state funds** under the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program. **It spent 32 percent of these funds on basic assistance**, generally as cash assistance to TANF families.

## Federal TANF Allocation and State Maintenance-of-Effort (MOE) Amounts

- In 2019, South Carolina was awarded its TANF block grant of \$100 million and an additional \$12 million in contingency funds.
- Since unspent block grant funds can be carried over to future years, a state may spend more or less than its annual block grant allocation in any given year. As of 2019, South Carolina has not accumulated any unspent TANF block grant funds.
- Every year each state must also spend, from its own funds, at least 80 percent of its historical spending on poor families with children. (A state may spend more than its minimum.) This “MOE” requirement can be reduced to 75 percent if a state meets specific work participation rate requirements. In 2019, South Carolina met these requirements and was subject to the 75 percent MOE obligation.

The annual federal TANF block grant has been frozen since its creation and lost about 40 percent of its value between 1997 and 2019 due to inflation.
