Indiana's 2005 income tax threshold

Rank among the 42 states with income taxes

(The income level at which families begin paying income tax)

(1 = lowest threshold)

For single-parent families of three: \$13,800

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Indiana's 2005 income tax levied on working-poor and near-poor families

Rank (1 = highest tax)

For families of three with incomes at the poverty line (\$15,577): \$77

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For families of four with incomes at the poverty line (\$19,961): \$222


For families of four with incomes at 125% of poverty line (\$24,951): \$455

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Indiana's income tax threshold is declining relative to the poverty line.

- Indiana's tax threshold for families of four was substantially increased in 2003, but since then it has declined relative to the poverty line.
- Without legislative action, Indiana's income tax threshold will fall further below the poverty line.
