

# Arkansas' income tax treatment of poor families will improve substantially in 2007.

- Since 1994, Arkansas' income tax on families of four with poverty-level income has risen by \$213, an increase of 44 percent after accounting for inflation.
- Beginning in 2007, Arkansas will raise its threshold close to the poverty line and reduce taxes substantially for families with incomes just over the poverty line.
