

West Virginia's income tax treatment of poor families will improve substantially beginning in 2007.

- West Virginia's tax threshold for families of four has been fixed at \$10,000 since 1996. It has deteriorated over that time from 62 percent of the poverty line to 50 percent of the poverty line.
- A new low-income tax credit enacted in late 2006 will reduce income tax liabilities for most poor families in 2007 and eliminate them by 2008.
